

## Important visa information

Please note that you may have to apply for a visa in order to study at the Aarhus School of Architecture. In general citizens from a country which is member of the EU Union (plus Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland) do not need a visa, whereas all others do.

The visa procedure is handled through the Danish Immigration Service, and at their web site, you will find the up-dated information about the visa process, requirements and handling time. The address for the web site is:

The process of obtaining a visa is in general terms (the following information is **NOT** comprehensive; you must carefully read the available information on the Immigration web site):

Once you have been admitted, we will send you the ST1 visa form. This form is signed by us, and the names of the accepted students are reported to the Immigration Service. You should hand in the ST1 form, with any required additional information, to the nearest Danish Representation (listed on the web site of the Danish State Department: [www.um.dk](http://www.um.dk) ). Please note that a fee has to be paid for the visa process.

If you are required to pay tuition to the Aarhus School of Architecture, please note that the payment has to have been successfully transferred to our account **BEFORE** we can issue a visa form – we can NOT be made responsible for any delays, due to a late transfer of tuition.

In the recent years, there have been problems with the number of visa applicants causing the processing time to be increased dramatically. It is therefore our best advice that you familiarize yourself with the requirements, fees and process as early as possible, and preferably before your application to the Aarhus School of Architecture is finalized.

As the visa application process is a matter between the applicant and the Immigration Service, we have but very little influence on the processing time and no influence on the final decision.
