

Call Rogier Hintzen Talent Award 2021

The Award

The Rogier Hintzen Talent Award (RHTA) is a posthumous tribute to him and aims to encourage young (physician) researchers in MS research. The Department of Neurology and Rogier's wife Eleonoor will award the Rogier Hintzen Talent Award, an annual incentive prize of €3,000 for talented researchers in the field of MS, for a period of 12 years - the period Rogier would still have been working. The second Rogier Hintzen Award will be presented on Wednesday September 29th at the Sociëteit De Maas in Rotterdam. Candidates can be nominated and apply until August 29th.

Criteria

- Talented MS (medical) researcher
- Has performed clinical or laboratory research within the MS field
- Age < 40 yrs
- Driven to develop further within the MS field

Apply

- Candidates can apply themselves or be nominated
- Short motivation by the submitter why he/she qualifies for the RHTA and the ambitions for career development (max 300 words)
- Submit Curriculum Vitae
- Applications must be accompanied by a letter of recommendation by research leader or (co)supervisor.

- Latest application date is Sunday, August 29th 2021
- Evaluation of the candidates by the committee where one candidate will be selected for award of the RHTA. The committee will meet in the week of September 6th 2021 to evaluate the candidates. At this meeting one candidate will be selected to be awarded with the RHTA.
- The candidate is nominated for the award of the RHTA to the Board of the Erasmus MC Foundation for final decision
- No later than the week of September 13th, all candidates will be informed of the result
- The second RHTA will be awarded on Wednesday September 29th at the Sociëteit De Maas in Rotterdam (meeting 16.30 - 18.45 hrs)
