#### **Higher yacht licenses** and continued privatisation efforts announced in budget

Finance minister Tonio Fenech emphasised the government's continued efforts towards the pirvatisation of the Msida, Ta' Xbiex and Gozo yacht marinas, saying that the Privatisation Unit is currently preparing a call for offers.

Fenech also mentioned the current search for locations for new yacht marinas with the aim of developing around 1000 new berths and land space where boats can be repaired and stored during winter.

Annual yacht registration fees for yachts registered under the Small Ships Regulations were revised so that they now range from €90 for craft without an engine and measuring over 12feet to €200 for craft with engines over 150hp. New rates will be applicable as from January 1 2009 and are expected to generate €1,000,000.

#### In Memoriam Lawrence **Camilleri**

On Monday 19th October Lawrence Camilleri, of Camilleri Marine, passed away while in Tunisia. Lawrence, who had been in the boating industry for nearly 30 years, owned and ran a very well known and popular chandlery in Ta' Xbiex. Lawrence, who owned a sailing boat, was also an avid sailor who loved diving, fishing and reading. He ran a business with other Maltese partners in Tunisia and was staying at a house he shared with them at the time of his death, however he was alone on the night he died. Lawrence suffered a heart attack early on Monday morning - he managed to drive himself to the closest hospital however he died upon arrival.

His funeral was held on Saturday 25th at Sta Venera Parish church. He leaves to mourn his wife, Luella nee Pellegrini, his sons Kenneth and Robert and the entire boating community.
